Container Trucking Guide





Vehicle Access Control System

The Port of Vancouver's Vehicle Access Control System (VACS) has been in operation since July 2004. Please become acquainted with the vehicle access procedures when entering the gates to the South Shore roadway (see centrefold map). Procedures for entering and exiting these gates will change depending on the declared security level under which the Port is operating. At low risk security, called *Marsec Level 1*, gates will automatically open for large trucks. Procedures will become more restrictive as the security level increases. For complete instructions on accessing Port property, see below.

Please note: Terminals may require that drivers produce identification.

Truck entry procedures MARSEC LEVEL ONE

Truck vehicle classification system.

- The truck lane is fitted with a vehicle classification system that allows the gate to open automatically when a truck is electronically identified.
- The truck must slow down and proceed through the gate at the recommended speed of 20 km/hr.
- The gate will automatically open when the truck is electronically recognized.
- Gates will automatically open for trucks exiting.

Truck entry procedures MARSEC LEVEL TWO

- A PORT PASS will be required to open gates.
- Pass must be scanned over the proxy reader.
- Follow the instructions on the signal board.
- For questions, press the intercom to contact the control room.
- Exit procedures will be the same as for entering.

Truck entry procedures MARSEC LEVEL THREE

In addition to the requirements for MARSEC LEVEL TWO:

- Guards will be located at the Guard Booths.
- Access is at the discretion of Security.

Overweight and Dimensional Trucking Procedures

All oversize carriers are requested to notify VPA Security at 604-665-9346 prior to entering and leaving the VPA South Shore roadway (see centrefold map). Please note that the gates are 3.2 meters wide. The outside lanes are able to accommodate wider loads at both Clark Drive and Commissioner Street.

Entering the Port with an oversize load

- Contact VPA Security at 604-665-9346 thirty minutes before arrival.
- Identify when and where you wish to enter the Port as well as the width of the load.
- Security may identify an alternate entrance.

Exiting the Port with an oversize load

- Contact VPA Security at 604-665-9346 thirty minutes prior to departure.
- Identify the dimensions of the load and if you have a pilot vehicle with you.

PORT PASS

With security measures that meet or exceed North American standards, the Port of Vancouver has a well-earned reputation as a secure, safe and dependable place to do business. The Port of Vancouver continues to undertake several initiatives and programs to implement innovative security solutions that enhance and safeguard the movement of cargo and passengers through Canada's largest port. One initiative is requiring a PORT PASS for all Port community workers. A PORT PASS may be obtained from a Port approved agency. Important PORT PASS information

- Applicants are required to present two pieces of government issued personal identification when presenting their application form to the issuing agency. One piece of identification **MUST** be a primary piece of identification incorporating a photograph taken within the last five years. (eg. driver's license, passport, BC ID card – new digital style only, government issued photo ID, firearms acquisition certificate). A secondary piece of identification may consist of either a birth certificate or Care Card.
- The PORT PASS is for individual use only and will be personalized with photo ID. Passes may not be shared or transferred and no "Company" or common passes will be issued.
- If you experience trouble with your card contact the agency that issued your card.
- A company and/or sole proprietorship that picks up or delivers goods or services within the Port must request a sponsorship letter, on company letterhead, from the facility or company with whom they conduct business.

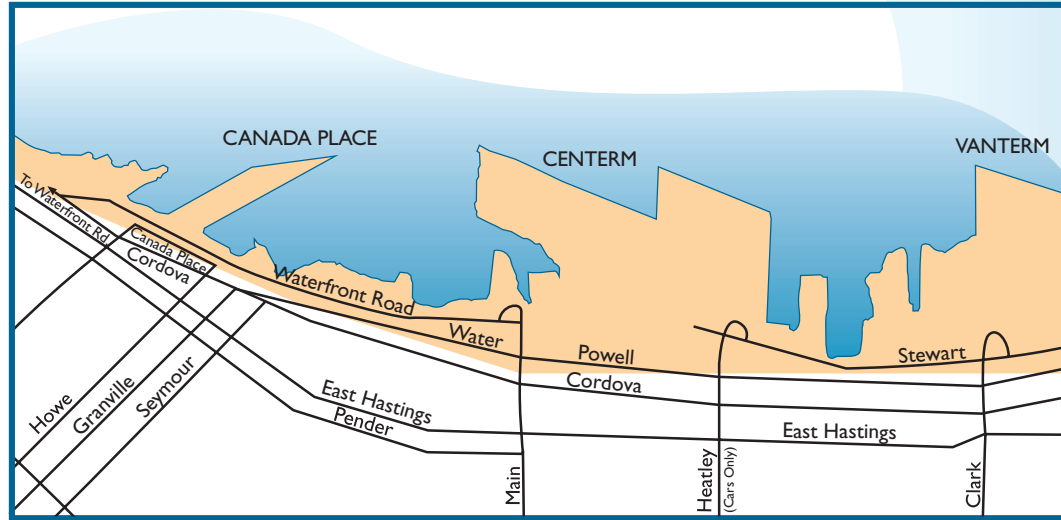
Visitor Pass

- If you conduct business infrequently at the Port (i.e. 2-3 x year) then you will not qualify for a PORT PASS but be considered a "Visitor" and will be required to show two pieces of government issued personal identification and state the nature of your visit and destination for entry. In the event of heightened security requirements, you may experience delay in entry, or be denied entry without a PORT PASS. At Security Level Three, no one without a pass or prior approval will be allowed access to the Port.

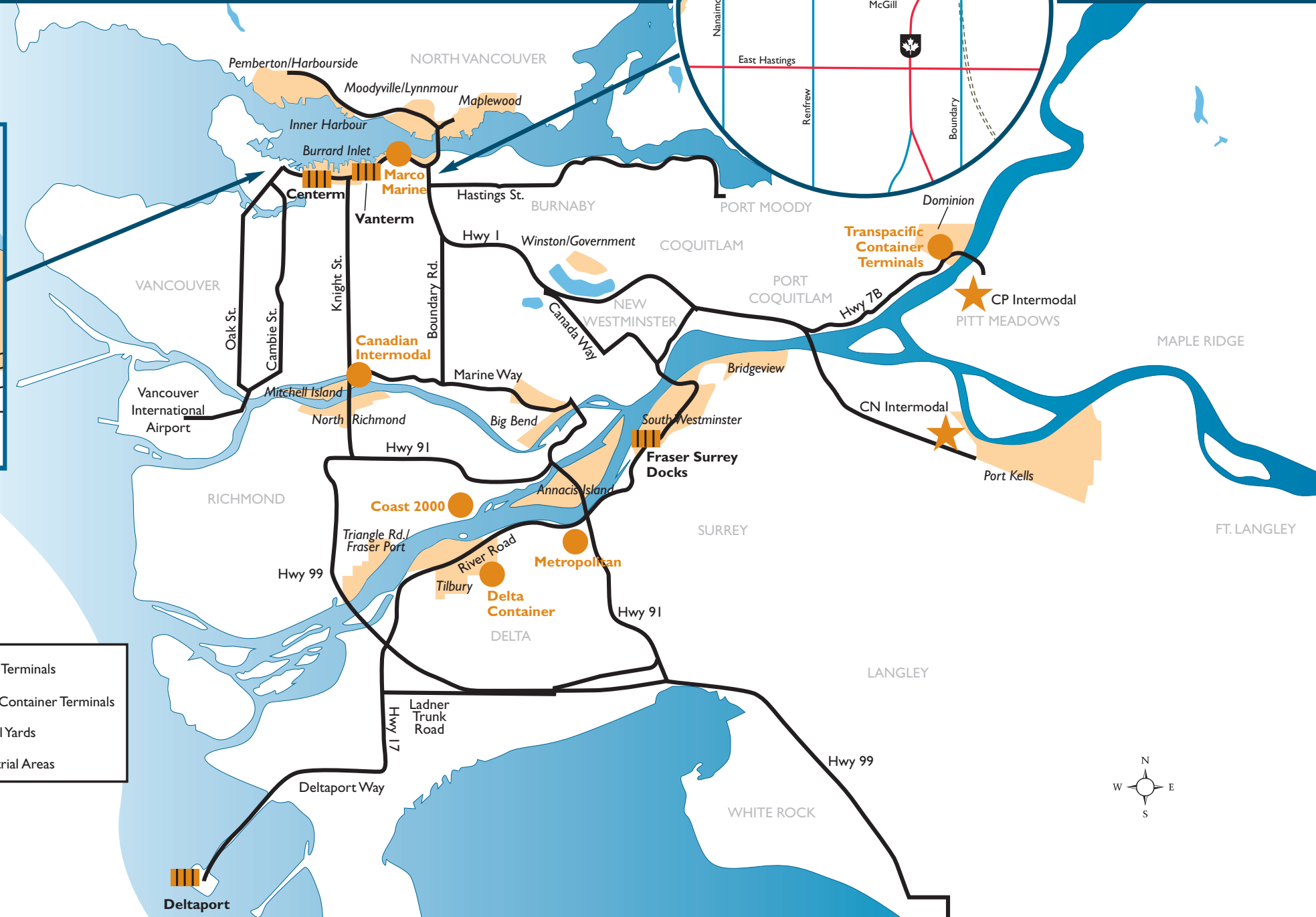
South Shore Roadway (East)
